

The following ordinance, which was previously introduced in written form required for adoption at a regular meeting of the Parish Council on March 25, 2021, a summary thereof having been published in accordance with law, together with a notice of public hearing which was held in accordance with said public notice, was brought up for final passage April 8, 2021, on Motion of Shane Mack and seconded by Maurice "Scooter" Keen:

L. P. ORDINANCE NO. 21-07

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCES CREATING GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. SIX OF THE PARISH OF LIVINGSTON, STATE OF LOUISIANA, AND ABOLISHING SAID GRAVITY DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. SIX IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AUTHORITY AND PROVISIONS ESTABLISHED BY LOUISIANA R.S. 38:1798.1.

WHEREAS, Gravity Drainage District No. 6 (hereinafter referred to as the "District") of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, is a duly organized gravity drainage district within Livingston Parish, Louisiana, established by the Livingston Parish Council by ordinance adopted pursuant to R.S. 38:1752, et. seq., on August 13, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the District comprises and includes all of the property situated within the boundaries as shown on **Exhibit A**, hereto attached; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston Parish Council established the domicile of the District and appointed the board of supervisors thereof by ordinance adopted August 13, 2009; and

WHEREAS, the District is and has been inactive and has been unable to secure funding to operate for which it was created; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston Parish Council believes it is in the best interest of the residents of the District for the District to be dissolved pursuant to the provisions of and under the authority granted by Louisiana R.S. 38:1798.1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LIVINGSTON PARISH COUNCIL, the governing authority of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, that the Livingston Parish Council hereby abolishes the District and repeals any and all ordinances adopted to create and establish the District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE LIVINGSTON PARISH COUNCIL that if any provision of this ordinance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items, or applications of this ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared severable.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Livingston Parish Council that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

The above and foregoing ordinance was introduced at a prior meeting, a public hearing was advertised and held thereon, and upon reading of the title was submitted to an official vote of the whole, and the vote thereon was as follows:

EXHIBIT A

Commencing at the intersection of the Livingston/St. Helena Parish line and the centerline of Middle Colyell Creek; thence, in an easterly direction, along the Livingston/St. Helena Parish line to its intersection with the Livingston/Tangipahoa Parish line; thence, in a southerly direction, along the Livingston/Tangipahoa Parish line to its intersection with the centerline of Interstate Highway 12; thence, in a westerly direction, along the centerline of Interstate Highway 12 to its intersection with the centerline of Middle Colyell Creek; thence, in a northerly direction, along the centerline of Middle Colyell Creek to its intersection with the south line of the City of Walker; thence, in an easterly direction, to the southeast corner of the City of Walker; thence, in a northerly direction, along the east line of the City of Walker to its intersection with the centerline of U.S. Highway 190; thence, in a northeasterly direction, along the centerline of U.S. Highway 190 to its intersection with a line 300 feet east and parallel to State Highway 449; thence, in a northerly direction, along a line 300 feet east and parallel to State Highway 449 to its intersection with the north line of Section 20, T6S-R4E; thence, in a westerly direction, along the north line of Sections 19 and 20, T6S-R4E to its intersection with the centerline of Middle Colyell Creek; thence, in a northerly direction, along the centerline of Middle Colyell Creek to the point of beginning:

Less and except therefrom: A certain tract of land located in Sections 20, 21, 28, and 29, Township 6 South, Range 4 East, Greensburg Land District, Livingston Parish, Louisiana, being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the existing northeast corner of the existing corporate limits of the town of Walker, proceed easterly along the north boundary line of the J.H. Jenkins property and Section 29, T6S-R4E, to the northwest corner of the Industrial Park Property; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the Industrial Park property to the northeast corner of the Industrial Park Property; thence southerly along the east boundary of the Industrial Park Property to the southern R/W of U.S. Hwy. 190; thence westerly along the southern R/W of U.S. Hwy. 190 to the existing corporate limits of the town of Walker; thence northerly along the existing corporate limits of the town of Walker back to the point of beginning containing approximately 284 acres more or less.
