## L.P. ORDINANCE NO.13-17

An ordinance directing the levy and collection of an ad valorem tax of two (2) mills on the dollar of assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation within the geographic boundaries of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the calendar year 2014 and ending with the year 2023, authorized under the provisions of Article VI, Section 26(B) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority as applicable, for the purpose of paying costs of programs for the elderly citizens of Livingston Parish to be administered by the Parish through the Livingston Council on Aging, including services, operations, capital improvements, equipment and other lawful expenses related thereto.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Article VI, Section 26(B) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, including an election held in the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Parish") on April 6, 2013, the Parish Council of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, desires to levy the ad valorem tax as authorized at the election by virtue of the favorable passage of the proposition attached hereto as **Schedule A** setting forth the rate and duration of the tax; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the provisions of said authority and other applicable constitutional and statutory authority, an election was held in the Parish on Saturday, April 6, 2013, to authorize the renewal of the levy of the ad valorem tax, it is now the desire of this Parish to renew the levy of the ad valorem tax and to provide for the collection thereof and other matters in connection therewith as hereinafter provided in this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Parish Council of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of the Parish, that:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the authority of an election held in the Parish on April 6, 2013, there be and there is hereby levied within the geographic boundaries of the Parish for the purposes stated in the proposition attached hereto as **Schedule A** an ad valorem tax of two (2) mills on the dollar of assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation in the Parish, beginning with the year 2014 and ending in 2023, to be dedicated and used for the purpose of paying costs of programs for the elderly citizens of Livingston Parish to be administered by the

Parish through the Livingston Council on Aging, including services, operations, capital improvements, equipment and other lawful expenses related thereto.

SECTION 2. That the ad valorem tax described in Section 1 above shall be levied, assessed, imposed, collected, paid and enforced according to law.

SECTION 3. The obligations and rights of tax payers in connection with the ad valorem tax levied hereby shall be as provided taxpayers by the provisions of law applicable to ad valorem taxes levied by the Parish.

SECTION 4. If any one or more of the provisions of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance, but this Ordinance shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained herein. Any constitutional or statutory provision enacted after the date of this Ordinance which validates or makes legal any provision of this Ordinance which would not otherwise be valid or legal, shall be deemed to apply to this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. Upon adoption, this Ordinance shall be published in full in one (1) issue of the *Livingston Parish News* and shall be recorded in the mortgage records of the Livingston Parish Clerk of Court.

SECTION 6. The Chairman of the Council be and she is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all such action as may be necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall immediately take effect upon adoption.

## **SCHEDULE A**

## **PROPOSITION**

Shall the Parish Council of the Parish of Livingston, State of Louisiana, under the provisions of Article VI, Section 26(B) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974 and other constitutional and statutory authority as applicable, be authorized to renew the levy and collection and adopt an Ordinance providing for such renewal of an ad valorem tax of two (2) mills on all property subject to taxation in the Parish (an estimated \$820,274.53 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) ("the Tax"), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2014 and ending with the year 2023, to be dedicated and used for the purpose of paying costs of programs for the elderly citizens of Livingston Parish to be administered by the Parish through the Livingston Council on Aging, including services, operations, capital improvements, equipment and other lawful expenses related thereto?
