The Livingston Parish Council met in regular session duly called, advertised, and convened at its regular meeting place, the Parish Council Chambers, Governmental Building, 20355 Government Boulevard, Livingston, Louisiana, on Thursday, February 8, 2018, at the hour of six (6:00) o'clock p.m. with the following Livingston Parish Council members present:

The chair asked the public to please mute or turn off their cell phones.

The chair announced that Public Input would be accepted from any member of the audience wishing to address an agenda item.

The chair addressed agenda item 7, "Presentations:", and called upon Councilman John Wascom. Councilman Wascom advised that he had visited with Joe Shumate at Ward 2 Marshal's office and overheard them discussing the new radios that had been acquired. Mr. Shumate was asked by Councilman Wascom to appear at the meeting to apprise of the use and benefits of the radios. He also expressed his gratitude to Mr. Shumate for his service as the Marshal of Ward 2. Mr. Shumate addressed the Council and boasted of the help their agency received from Mark Harrell, Director of the Livingston Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness. He advised that Mr. Harrell had been instrumental in helping the small agencies in our Parish (fire and law enforcement) to obtain the 700 Radio System. He briefly explained what the 700 Radio System was, and the need for them during emergencies for communication. Mr. Shumate expressed to the Councilmembers what a great asset Mark Harrell is to the Parish of Livingston and praised Mr. Harrell for his help. The Councilmembers thanked Mr. Shumate for his praises and acknowledgements of Mr. Harrell.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted.

The chair addressed agenda items 9, “Parish President’s Report:” and called upon Parish President Layton Ricks.

Mr. Ricks advised that he had a couple of things that he wished to convey and make the Council aware of. The first was located in Councilman Garry “Frog” Talbert’s district. Mr. Ricks had been contacted by Ms. Pat Wallner. Ms. Wallner is part of a beautification group and they would like to erect a sign and a flag with a flagpole in the median of a state highway. The Department of Transportation and Development is requesting a letter of concurrence from the Parish of Livingston to indicate that there is no objection to these actions. Mr. Ricks advised that this will not be of any cost to the Parish. He further advised that a resolution was not needed, but he wanted the Council to be aware that the project was happening. Councilman Talbert concurred that he was in support of the project.

Secondly, Mr. Ricks advised of recent news that Ascension Parish is planning on extending their levee system which will have adverse effects to our parish. He explained that a resolution had been adopted in June of 2014 expressing opposition of neighboring parishes conducting any new waterway expansions. The resolution was sent along with a letter to many, many agencies and individuals to promulgate this opposition. He further explained that he would be coming back to the Council at the next meeting, on February 22, 2018, to request that another resolution be adopted and sent with another letter to everyone possible to voice opposition to the parish of Ascension’s levee expansion. Mr. Ricks answered questions about the effects of the engineer study conducted by the Army Corps of Engineers of the proposed levee expansion. The chair allowed a brief open discussion.

Mr. Ricks continued with his report and instructed the Council that he would need to present a request for the approval of a change order for the Assessor’s new building, which may have some probability to save the Parish some money. He advised that he had authorized the Assessor to begin with some of the preliminary work on the project and would be requesting to put approval of the change order on the next meeting agenda.

**** Councilman Shane Mack entered the Council chambers at six-fourteen (6:14) p.m.**

The chair addressed agenda item 11, “Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness – Mark Harrell”. Having no business to report, the chair moved on to the next order of concern.

The chair addressed agenda item(s) 12 a through f, “Planning Commission Recommendations – Sam Digirolamo” and called upon Natalie Allen, Planning secretary. Ms. Allen advised that she was appearing before the Council on behalf of Planning Director, Sam Digirolamo.

Councilman Tracy Girlinghouse voiced his concerns that he had regarding agenda item 12a, “Dawson’s Creek Subdivision, approval of preliminary plat located on Florida Boulevard in Council District 7”, that may create possible drainage issues in his district.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted.

The chair addressed agenda item 16, “Requests for waiver(s) intended for the allowance of permitting due to the restrictions of L.P. No. 17-22, “Section 13-46.1, Prohibitions and Restrictions of Use” for mobile/manufactured homes to be placed in a named subdivision for the intent of onsite, custom built, single family homes”. Having not received a request, the chair moved on to the next agenda item.

The chair addressed agenda item 17, “District Attorney Report(s):”. Mr. Moody advised that he had nothing to report.

The chair addressed agenda items 18 a and b, Committee Report(s):

- Ordinance Committee – Shane Mack, Chair

Councilman Shane Mack explained that the final revisions had been made to the proposed Minor Subdivision ordinances and the Council clerk was in the process of putting the ordinances in the correct format. Upon completion, they would be forwarded to the Councilmembers for their review, and possibly be put on the February 22, 2018 meeting agenda. Councilman Mack further explained that he was still working on the pond ordinance, as well as a couple of other ordinances that had been submitted for consideration by the Planning Department, which would also be sent out for the Councilmembers to review for their consideration at the next meeting.

- Finance Committee – Garry “Frog” Talbert, Chair

Councilman Talbert reported that the committee had met earlier that day, in lieu of meeting in two (2) weeks. He indicated that there was no new business to report. He advised that the Finance Director had given the committee new revisions to the budget from last year and sales tax revenue was also discussed.
