

Minutes of the Livingston Parish Council
Livingston, Louisiana
May 14, 2020

In an effort to comply with the Proclamations made by Louisiana Governor John Bel Edwards and Livingston Parish President Layton Ricks the following option was offered to allow for Public Input to be made:

If you wish to appear in person for public input:

- We encourage the use of gloves and face masks for protection against the spread of COVID-19
- There will be a sign-up sheet in the lobby of the Governmental Building where you will sign and put what agenda item that you wish to speak in regard to.
- Anyone wishing to speak in person must sign in on the sign-up sheet no later than five-fifty (5:50) p.m. on Thursday, May 14, 2020.
- No more than five (5) people will be allowed in the lobby at time while maintaining their six (6) feet distancing requirement and will be escorted into the Council chambers when it is their turn for public input.
- Only one (1) person at a time will be allowed in the Council chambers to speak on each agenda.

The Livingston Parish Council met in a regular session duly called, advertised, and convened at its regular meeting place, the Parish Council Chambers, Governmental Building, 20355 Government Boulevard, Livingston, Louisiana, on Thursday, May 14, 2020, at the hour of six o'clock (6:00) p.m. with the following Livingston Parish Council members present:

The chair asked anyone that was present to please mute or turn off their cell phones.

The chair explained the procedures put in place for anyone wishing to make submissions for Public input and wished to be physically present to address an agenda item in the Council chambers.

The chair addressed agenda item 7a and b, "Adoption of the Minutes" and requested for both items to be addressed at the same time to which no one objected.

LPR NO. 20-105

MOTION was made by John Wascom and duly seconded by Tracy Girlinghouse to adopt and dispense with the reading of the minutes and adopt as written for the minutes dated March 12, 2020, and April 9, 2020 of the regular meeting(s) of the Livingston Parish Council and adopt as written.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted.

The chair addressed agenda item 8, “Parish President’s Report”, and declared that it was his understanding that there was nothing to report at that time from Administration.

The chair indicated that he wished to move up a few agenda items to accommodate those waiting who had signed up for Public input.

The chair identified that he would be addressing agenda item number 19, “Approve a waiver request of Section 125-3, Prohibitions and restrictions of use, to allow a mobile home to be placed in a named subdivision for Tara Still located at 17926 Mayflower Street, Livingston, LA 70754 in Mayflower Subdivision, Council District 8” and asked the Council clerk to read from the Public input list who had signed up for this agenda item.

Public input: David May, resident of Justin Drive, Denham Springs:
 developer of Mayflower Subdivision appearing on behalf of Tara Still

Mr. May explained that he was the owner of the lot in this subdivision and had sold the lot to Tara Still. He advised Ms. Still when she purchased the property that she would be allowed to put a mobile home on this property. He also explained that as courtesy, she had went through the neighborhood in the subdivision and made sure that it would be alright and they all agreed that they were okay with her plans of moving her mobile home on that lot.

Councilman Randy Delatte asked if this would be the only mobile home in the subdivision? Mr. May advised that it was not, there were others as well. Councilman Tracy Girlinghouse asked how old was the development? Mr. May indicated that it was about ten (10) years old. Councilman Girlinghouse wished to confirm that there were multiple mobile homes in this subdivision to which Mr. May confirmed.

Public input: Tara Still-resident of Winter Ridge, Walker: requesting the waiver of
 Section 125-3

Ms. Still advised that she had signed agreements with the neighboring property owners in the subdivision that they were alright with her moving a mobile home on the lot that she purchased in the subdivision and also confirmed other mobile homes that were located there.

The chair addressed agenda item number 15, “Waiver of Section 125-9, “Submittals”, to subdivide a lot in LA Trace located in Council District 8” and asked the Council clerk to read the next names from the Public input sign in sheet.

Public input: Sean Allain: resident of Live Oak Drive, Brusly, LA: requesting the waiver

The chair allowed the Councilmembers to ask Mr. Allain questions in an open discussion.

Public input: Samantha Beard-resident of Brusly and co-requestor of the waiver to subdivide

Councilman Girlinghouse requested to clarify his vote in favor of this resolution as this property issue is a case considered to be “out of the normal” circumstances.

The chair allowed an open discussion all agreeing of the need for this waiver.

LPR NO. 20-107

MOTION was made by Randy Delatte and duly seconded by Garry Talbert **to approve a waiver request** of the Code of Ordinances for Section 125-9, “Submittals”, to subdivide a lot in LA Trace located in Council District 8 for Sean Allain and Samantha Beard who appeared before the Livingston Parish Council explaining that they wish to purchase one (1) lot with a road and two (2) addresses and their mortgage company mandates the subdivision of the lot for the approval of their loan.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted.

The chair addressed agenda item number 18, “Adopt a resolution for the consideration and approval of a waiver of Section 125-12.4, requiring an access servitude of forty (40’) feet and grant the allowance an access servitude of twenty-two (22’) in width adjacent to the existing home on the required forty (40’) servitude width when said servitude is less than 1,056 linear feet in length” and called for the next Public input listed on the sign in sheet.

Councilman Talbert asked several questions regarding what sewer utilities were provided in this area. He discussed at length the requirements needed for sewer installation.

The chair called for Public input on this agenda item.

Public input: Janet Richard-resident of Hammack Road, Denham Springs, LA: requesting waiver (An unidentified male family member also appeared with Ms. Richard)

Ms. Richard discussed the purchase of the property in question and being misinformed on the ordinance mandates required for their plans to develop.

The chair requested input from Councilman R.C. “Bubba” Harris. Councilman Harris was not in favor of granting a waiver for this property.

The chair allowed the Councilmembers to question Ms. Richard in an open discussion.

Councilman Garry Talbert suggested that Ms. Richard meet with the Health Department and find out what the requirements were for a servitude in the back of the property, then visit with the neighboring property owner about granting her an egress servitude on part of his property to complete the required footage.

The chair allowed an open discussion and it was determined without a vote to defer this item without a date.

The chair addressed agenda item 9, “ Update from Charter Communications on internet services on Red Oak Road” and called upon Councilman Randy Delatte.

Councilman Delatte explained that he had been in contact with Mr. Ed Serna who has taken over the position of our Charter Communications representative and requested that he give an update of the prior information that Charter had given regarding the costs analysis for the Red Oak Road residents to receive services. Councilman Delatte asked if Mr. Serna could put that in a more precise manner in case the Parish would be able to apply for a grant. Mr. Serna has been working on that and keeping him up to date, calling Councilman Delatte at least once a week, but because of COVID-19, he could not attend the Council meeting that evening. He also stated that Mr. Serna has not completed everything yet that Councilman Delatte has requested in order to give an update to the Councilmembers.

Councilman Delatte asked the Councilmembers to review the news article from the Advocate dated May 1st that was included in their meeting packet. He advised that it was regarding two hundred sixty million dollars (\$260,000,000.00) that the federal government has already paid Louisiana to provide internet service to the schools that could not have internet service that also included buying laptops. He stated that he wanted to get some general discussion on it. He indicated that after this story came out on social media, there have been places all over the Parish that do not have internet services. He wondered since our federal delegation had obtained this appropriation, he wanted to make sure that our state legislative delegate to do the same and make sure that Livingston Parish received that share of our money and also write something to the school board to see what their plans are to utilize this money or if they know about it. He thought that they did know about it because they had done a survey earlier that day in some parts of Livingston Parish going out asking if they had laptops and if they had internet service. He was not sure where all it went out in the Parish, but he did know that it went out to the residents of Red Oak Road. He stated that he would like to get some discussion on it, some better ideas, but basically, he would like to see that they get their share of that money and that they are able to connect Livingston Parish residents that are not connected now and have the same opportunities as everybody else. He stated that it was not just the school children, a lot of people work at home also who do not have internet service. He wanted to explore all the options and maybe see what they could do talking it out and come up with a plan of action.

Councilman Talbert asked if he wanted to send a resolution or a letter to the Governor of Louisiana to ask to utilize some of this money to provide internet service to Livingston Parish?

Councilman Delatte stated that anything that would work, even our state delegation. Councilman Maurice “Scooter” Keen, Councilman Jeff Ard and Councilman Talbert suggested sending it to Garret Graves as a “cc” along with Livingston Parish’s state delegation.

Councilman Delatte stated that he thought that they should get some sort of feedback from the school board as they may not be aware of certain situations and maybe see what their plan is so they could keep abreast of what is going on.

The chair stated the action of Council would be to request the Council clerk to write a letter and forward it to the appropriate individuals at the school board to try to obtain some of that data from them.

Councilman Talbert stated that there were nine (9) school board members, the school board superintendent, the Legislative delegation from the Parish and the Governor’s office that the letter should be addressed to.

Councilman Delatte stated that the school board may be willing to send someone from the school board administration to speak to the Council on behalf of what they have planned. He continued to state that at one time, the local Parish government was responsible for the cable service, but he was not sure who was responsible for it now.

The chair answered that it was private industries. Councilman Talbert asked if he was to understand that Livingston Parish received four point four million dollars (\$4,400,000.00) in money already? Councilman Delatte advised that was what the article stated. Councilman Talbert stated that the Council needed to find out if the school board was receiving those funds, are they using those funds to obtain computers or are they trying to improve the internet access to the individuals that live in the area.

The chair allowed a brief open discussion and then stated that he wished to re-cap what the resolution would state to forward to the Legislative delegation, the Governor, to take a look and ensure that Livingston Parish was getting their fair share of this federal funding.

Councilman Delatte questioned who would be administrating these funds? Would it be Parish government, the Parish school board? He would like that to be included in the letter.

The chair allowed an open discussion before the vote.

The Council clerk requested for the chair to confirm who the letter will be sent to. It will be sent to the Governor, the Livingston Parish Legislative delegation and the Livingston Parish School Board. The chair concurred and confirmed this to the Council clerk.

MOTION was made by Jeff Ard and duly seconded by Tracy Girlinghouse to send a letter to the Livingston Parish School Board superintendent and its nine (9) board members, the Livingston Parish Legislative delegation and the Governor of Louisiana requesting information regarding the federal aid received by public schools that have been allocated to the state of Louisiana to help aid with costs sparked by the Coronavirus pandemic and to address learning gaps after the loss of weeks of traditional instruction for school children to ensure that all students have access to obtain laptops or tablets as well as internet access, as well as other urgent needs.

MOTION was made by Randy Delatte and duly seconded by Garry Talbert to issue a Letter of No Objection to property owner, Shane Collins, said property being addressed at 18421 LA Trace Road, French Settlement, Louisiana 70733, as mandated by the Office of State Lands for application of a Water Bottom Lease located in Council District 8, with work for proposed development being performed by Sharp Brothers Construction, L.L.C.

The chair addressed agenda item number 11, “Reschedule Public Hearing and Adoption of L.P. Ordinance No. 20–05, Servitude Revocation: John Cooper Fore/Old River Road; Proposed date: Thursday, May 28, 2020”.

The Council clerk requested to clarify the need for this agenda item. This ordinance was introduced on March 12, 2020 at a regular meeting of the Council and the Public Hearing was scheduled on March 26, 2020 at six o’clock (6:00) p.m. The March 26, 2020 meeting was cancelled due to the stay at home order caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Under advisement from our Legal Counsel, Mr. Christopher Moody, this proposed ordinance was placed on the next available meeting agenda to announce that it would be re-scheduled, and the notice published in the Parish’s Official Journal.

Both the co-chair and chair directed the Council clerk to read the ordinance by title.

Thereupon the chair declared that the Motion had carried and was adopted.

The chair addressed agenda item number 12, “Update on Deer Lake Subdivision located off of Hwy 442, North of Albany, in Council District No. 9”

The chair explained that he had been contacted by some of his constituents for an update regarding the development of Deer Lake Subdivision. It was his understanding that Mr. Chris Moody was prepared to give an update but was unable to attend the meeting that evening. He reiterated that the Council had voted for Mr. Moody to review if the proper ordinances were

followed regarding this development. The chair requested that the Council defer this item for two (2) weeks.

The council clerk requested to share knowledge with the Councilmembers regarding Mr. Moody’s absence at the meeting. He had conveyed to the Council office that he wanted to make room for others to attend the meeting due to the COVID-19 social distancing mandates and restrictions. He was watching the meeting live and was ready by his phone to answer any questions that the Councilmembers may have.

The chair addressed agenda item number 13, “Adopt resolution to authorize a waiver of Section 110-1 (c) in regard to the eight (8’) foot high solid wood fence requirement between conflicting land uses and allow a six (6’) foot high solid fence to be granted to Joule, LLC on behalf of South Alexander Development I, LLC located on George White Road, Holden, LA in Council District 9”.

The chair gave a brief history of Joule’s history and the previous waiver that was granted for parking that would allow limestone instead of hard surface pavement. He explained that they were coming back to request a waiver of the eight (8’) fence requirement and allow a six (6’) foot fence with two (2’) feet of barbed wire at the top.

The chair allowed a lengthy open discussion. The Councilmembers concurred that it was best to defer this issue for two (2) weeks and put this item on the next agenda.

The chair addressed agenda item number 14, “Amend LPR No. 20-097 adopted on March 12, 2020 to reflect “Hunstock Drive as Hunstock Avenue (entry road to Hunstock Hills Subdivision)” and called upon Councilman Garry Talbert who explained why the resolution was needed.

The chair addressed agenda item number 16, “Authorize a waiver for David Wiggins allowing a structure across his property lines located on Lots 12 and 13 of Block A on Paradise Road in Council District 8” and called upon Councilman Randy Delatte.

Councilman Delatte explained that the property in question was two (2) small lots located in Mut’s Paradise. Mr. Wiggins does not have enough footage on either lot to put his mobile home length wise across, so he is requesting to be allowed to place it horizontally. He recently bought the properties a month ago and plans on building a site built home if he enjoys living on the property. At that time, he will consolidate the two (2) lots before building. If not, he has already spoken with the two neighboring property owners and they would like to each purchase their neighboring lot.

Councilman Talbert asked what Councilman Delatte’s feelings were on this matter. Councilman Delatte was not opposed to granting the waiver and had spoken to Mr. Sam Digirolamo who originally requested the waiver on Mr. Wiggins. Mr. Digirolamo did not have a problem with the request as the lots were so small.

Councilman Maurice “Scooter” Keen requested to share with the Councilmembers that he had this same issue in his district.

The chair allowed a brief open discussion.

MOTION was offered by Randy Delatte and duly seconded by John Wascom to authorize a waiver for David Wiggins allowing a structure across his property lines located on Lots 12 and 13 of Block A on Paradise Road in Council District 8.

Councilman Harris explained that he had been contacted by the gentleman who requested this agenda item and he wished to remove this item from the agenda. He informed Councilman Harris that he would be working with DEMCO to resolve the problem.

The chair declared that no action would be taken on this item.

The chair addressed agenda item number 20, “Remove Sharon Kay Drive from being considered for the Priority Road/Capital Outlay List located in Council District 1 and called upon Councilman Jeff Ard.

Councilman Ard explained that he had asked to put this on at their last Council meeting and was told that this road was in the parish maintenance system. The subdivision that this street was built in was built years ago and had two (2) roads going through it that were intended to be connected, but never did. One (1) road was brought into the system several years ago and the other road was assumed to be taken in at that time as well, but it never was. For this reason, Councilman Ard is requesting to have this road removed.

Councilman John Wascom stated that he supported him either way that Councilman Ard wished to go.
