# Minutes of the Livingston Parish Council Livingston, Louisiana November 18, 2021

The Livingston Parish Council met in a regular session duly called, advertised, and convened at its regular meeting place, the Parish Council Chambers, Governmental Building, 20355 Government Boulevard, Livingston, Louisiana, on Thursday, November 18, 2021, at the hour of five o'clock (5:00) p.m. with the following Livingston Parish Council members present:

The chair called the meeting to order.

The chair asked the public to please mute or turn off their cell phones.

The chair announced that Public Input would be accepted from any member of the audience wishing to address an agenda item and explained the procedure to be called upon.

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The chair addressed agenda item number 8, "Adopt resolution to approve Bercen Chemicals, LLC for participation in the Louisiana Industrial Tax Exemption Program (Project location: 30140 Eden Church Road, Denham Springs, LA 70726) – David Bennett, LEDC Director/Maurice "Scooter" Keen" and called upon Mr. David Bennett.

Mr. Bennett gave a detailed report on the project and answered questions from the Council members.

Ms. Simmons answered questions submitted from the Council members.

# A RESOLUTION OF THE LIVINGSTON PARISH COUNCIL APPROVING BERCEN CHEMICALS LLC FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE LOUISIANA INDUSTRIAL TAX EXEMPTION PROGRAM.

**WHEREAS,** Bercen Chemicals LLC plans to make a multimillion-dollar investment in their facility near the Denham Springs in Livingston Parish ("Project"); and

**WHEREAS,** Bercen Chemicals LLC will provide significant economic benefits to the Denham Springs area and the Parish of Livingston through the job creation, spending and job retention related to this project; and

**WHEREAS,** Bercen Chemicals LLC filed Advance Notification Form #20200094-ITE for said Project with the Louisiana Department of Economic Development for participation in the Louisiana Industrial Tax Exemption Program; and

WHEREAS, Bercen Chemicals LLC is seeking property tax abatements available through participation in the Louisiana Industrial Property Tax Exemption Program to support Bercen Chemicals LLC's decision to add additional capacity to its manufacturing facility in the Denham Springs, LA area; and

**WHEREAS,** Article 7, Section 21(F) of the Louisiana Constitution provides for the Board of Commerce and Industry ("BCI"), with the approval of the Governor, to approve contracts for the exemption of ad valorem taxes of a new manufacturing establishment or an addition to an existing manufacturing establishment, on such terms and conditions as the board, with the approval of the Governor, deems in the best interest of the state; and

**WHEREAS,** Bercen Chemicals LLC filed a timely Application for Industrial Tax Exemption ("ITE") participation with the Louisiana Department of Economic Development; and

**WHEREAS,** Bercen Chemicals LLC Application for participation in the ITE Program was reviewed and approved by the Louisiana Board of Commerce and Industry on October 27, 2021; and

**WHEREAS,** Administrative Code, Title 13, Chapter 5, §503 provides for the Livingston Parish Council to approve or deny this Application for participation in the ITE Program.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** upon consideration of the foregoing and the public discussion held this day, that this Livingston Parish Council approves the ITE Application for Bercen Chemicals LLC's proposed Project.

**THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by this Livingston Parish Council, that a copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Louisiana Department of Economic Development.

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The chair addressed agenda item number 7, "Presentations", and called upon Councilman Jeff Ard.

Councilman Ard introduced the Livingston Parish Sheriff and encouraged him to come forward to speak about his Christmas Crusade.

Livingston Parish Sheriff Jason Ard thanked the Council members for inviting him to the meeting and giving him the opportunity to remind everyone about the annual Christmas Crusade. He advised that the crusade would begin on the Saturday after the Thanksgiving holiday. He described the application process, where deputies would be located for collections, the background and long history of the program and asked the Council members to help and spread the word about the crusade. He advised that they would accept monetary donations and new toys that can be dropped off at three Walmart locations in the Parish, as well as Bass Pro, or they can call the Sheriff's office and if it is a large enough pickup they can send a deputy or the Sheriff will go himself.

Sheriff Ard asked if there was anyone who had any questions about the crusade. He answered their questions and offered that the donations made could be a tax write-off as this program was rendered into a 501 3c classification. He advised that all deputy participation is on a volunteer basis and not will serve working on the Christmas crusade while they on duty.

The chair wished to note that before Sheriff Ard left, Councilman Jeff Ard would like to come down from the dais to the floor where the Sheriff was speaking. Councilman Jeff Ard stated that the Parish Council desired to be the next organization to be a part of the crusade.
