The Livingston Parish Council met in a regular session duly called, advertised, and convened at its regular meeting place, at the Governmental Building in the Parish Council Chambers, 20355 Government Boulevard, Livingston, Louisiana, on Thursday, May 26, 2022, at the hour of six o'clock (6:00) p.m. with the following Livingston Parish Council members present:

The chair called the meeting to order.

The chair asked the public to please mute or turn off their cell phones.

The chair called upon Judge Brian Abels to read a statement that honored Mr. Fabian Brignac and his service to the Livingston Parish community. Judge Abels read aloud to the audience Mr. Brignac's resignation letter as a longtime board member of Fire Protection District No. 8.

Councilman McMorris proceeded to the lectern and stated that he wished to make a motion to accept the resignation of Fabian Brignac from the French Settlement Fire Protection District No. 8 board, upon which Councilman Randy Delatte stated that he wished to second that motion.
