The Livingston Parish Council met in a regular session duly called, advertised, and convened at its regular meeting place, at the Governmental Building in the Parish Council Chambers, 20355 Government Boulevard, Livingston, Louisiana, on Thursday, June 9, 2022, at the hour of six o'clock (6:00) p.m. with the following Livingston Parish Council members present:

The chair called the meeting to order.

The chair asked the public to please mute or turn off their cell phones.

The chair announced that Public Input would be accepted from any member of the audience wishing to address an agenda item and explained the procedure to be called upon.

The chair stated that he had previously announced that the Council would be having a sign-in sheet and he has had some discussion that has been brought back to him about it. He stated that he wished to make it clear that anyone from the public who wishes to speak on an agenda item will have plenty of time to speak. He proposed that anyone who wishes to speak on an agenda item and they sign up, will be given four (4) minutes to speak by the chairman. He further explained that the public would be allowed to call the Council office to advise that they were coming and they would be placed on the list to sign up. If someone wishes to speak on something that they hear during the meeting, they will be given two (2) minutes to speak on that agenda item. He advised that this will allow more time for the people who are present at the meeting to speak.

The chairmen requested that his fellow Councilmembers allow the public to speak during their time of input and let them finish before any questions are brought up or any confrontation back and forth with them. He informed the public that if they asked a question, that would be considered part of their time allotted for them to speak. He further reiterated that the Council wished for everyone to have plenty of time to be allowed to speak and say what they wished to say during their time of public input.

Councilman Tracy Girlinghouse suggested that anyone speaking during their public input, consider putting their questions at the end of their allotted time period.

The chair advised that the Council chambers would soon have a time clock installed that would have a countdown so that everyone would be able to see their time allotted as it counts down.

WHEREAS, the Parish of Livingston was devastated by a catastrophic weather event known as the August 2016 Flood that destroyed homes, businesses, schools, churches, and countless properties leaving these places uninhabitable; and

WHEREAS, several of the Parish of Livingston’s voting precinct locations were affected by this devastation and were forced to temporarily relocate to other locations; and

WHEREAS, the polling location for Precincts 24, 24B, 24C, 28A and 28B are currently located at Lewis Vincent Elementary, being addressed at 7686 Vincent Road in Denham Springs, LA 70726, and has been a temporary location necessitated by the devastation of the August 2016 Flood; and

WHEREAS, the Livingston Parish Clerk of Court’s office has notified the Livingston Parish Council that it wishes to move Precincts 24, 24B, 24C, 28A, and 28B back to Southside Junior High and Southside Elementary, and has been deemed ready and available for use as the polling location for said precincts, allowing them to move back into their original location; and

WHEREAS, Precincts 24, 24B, 24C, shall hereby be moved back to its original located at Southside Junior High and Precincts 28A and 28B shall be moved back to its original location at Southside Elementary, as both locations have been deemed ready and available for use as the polling location for said precincts, allowing them to move back into their original location; and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Livingston Parish Council under the authority granted by Louisiana R.S. 18:534, and pursuant to the request and recommendation by the Livingston Parish Clerk of Court’s office that voting Precincts 24, 24B, and 24C are hereby relocated to its original location at Southside Junior High, 26535 LA Highway 16, Suite B, Denham Springs, LA 70726, and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Livingston Parish Council under the authority granted by Louisiana R.S. 18:534, and pursuant to the request and recommendation by the Livingston Parish Clerk of Court’s office that voting Precincts 28A and 28B are hereby relocated to its original location at Southside Elementary, 26535 LA Highway 16, Suite A, Denham Springs, LA 70726, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Livingston Parish Council that the Council Clerk is hereby directed to carry out the mandates of R.S. 18:535 et. seq. by giving such notice and taking such steps as required to adequately notify candidates and voters of said change. Councilman Talbert stated that Councilman Girlinghouse made the motion to accept, Councilman Talbert wished to make the motion to amend, and then they needed to vote on that, then they could vote.

The Council clerk questioned if the Council was voting to adopt the ordinance first? Mr. Moody stated no, there would be a motion to adopt and before you vote on that, there's a motion to amend the motion that is on the floor. He further explained that they would vote on the amendment first.
